A tireless volunteer in many organizations and an outspoken advocate of Delta Hospital and South Delta. Al, over the years fixed countless bikes and motorcycles for friends. For many years his hand made Napoleonic era replica cannon started the Vancouver Dragon Boat Races. He was a generous patron to Delta Hospital Foundation funding "The Forest for the Future" and a Nursing Educational Fund. Al preserved and donated significant and valuable historical material related to the BC Penn to the Canadian Correctional Service Museum, Kingston, On. His estate legacy will bless many other charitable organizations.
